Sierra Research, Inc. (“**Sierra**”), who was retained to provide certain environmental consulting services with respect to the Debtor’s Vernon, California, recycling facility for the Official Committee of Unsecured Creditors (the “**Committee**”) in the above-captioned case, submits this application (the “**Application**”) for its third monthly allowance of compensation for professional services rendered to the Committee for the period of August 1, 2014 through August 31, 2014 (the “**Application Period**”) and reimbursement of actual and necessary expenses incurred during the Application Period pursuant to sections 330 and 331 of title 11 of the United States Code, 11 U.S.C. §§ 101 *et seq.* (the “**Bankruptcy Code**”), Rule 2016 of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure (the “**Bankruptcy Rules**”), Rule 2016-2 of the Local Rules of Bankruptcy Practice and Procedure for the United States Bankruptcy Court of the District of Delaware (the “**Local Rules**”), the United States Trustee’s *Guidelines for Reviewing Applications for Compensation and Reimbursement of Expenses filed under 11 U.S.C. § 330* (the “**US Trustee Guidelines**”) and the *Administrative Order Establishing Procedures for Interim*

*Compensation and Reimbursement of Expenses of Professionals* (D.I. 330) (the “**Interim Compensation Procedures Order**”).<sup>2</sup>

### **JURISDICTION**

1. This Court has jurisdiction over this Application pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 157 and 1334. This is a core proceeding within the meaning of 28 U.S.C. § 157(b)(2). Venue in this district is proper pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1408 and 1409.

### **BACKGROUND**

2. On June 10, 2013 (the “**Petition Date**”), the Debtor filed a voluntary petition for relief under chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code.

3. The Debtor continues to operate its business and manage its affairs as debtor-in-possession pursuant to sections 1107 and 1108 of the Bankruptcy Code.

4. On June 18, 2013, the Office of the United States Trustee for the District of Delaware appointed an official committee of unsecured creditors (the “**Committee**”).

### **COMMITTEE PROFESSIONAL RETENTION**

5. On June 23, 2014, the Committee filed the *Application of the Official Committee of Unsecured Creditors of Exide Technologies for Entry of an Order nunc pro tunc to June 23, 2014 Authorizing the Employment and Retention of Sierra Research, Inc. to Provide Certain Environmental Consulting Services with Respect to the Debtor’s Vernon Facility, Including a Waiver of Certain Provision of Local Rule 2016-2* (D.I. 1924).

6. On July 2, 2014, this Court entered the *Order Authorizing the Official Committee of Unsecured Creditors of Exide Technologies to Employ and Retain Sierra Research, Inc. to Provide Certain Environmental Consultant Services with Respect to the Debtor’s Vernon*

*Facility, Including a Waiver of Certain Provisions of Local Rule 2016-2, nunc pro tunc to June 23, 2014 (the “**Retention Order**”)* (D.I. 1970).

### **FEE PROCEDURES ORDER**

7. On July 11, 2013, the Court entered the Interim Compensation Procedures Order, which sets forth the procedures for interim compensation and reimbursement of expenses for all professionals in this case.

8. In particular, the Interim Compensation Procedures Order provides that a Professional may file and serve a Monthly Fee Application on or after the twenty fifth (25<sup>th</sup>) day of each month following the month for which compensation is sought. Provided that there are no objections to the Monthly Fee Application filed within twenty one (21) days after the service of a Monthly Fee Application, the Professional may file a certificate of no objection with the court, after which the Debtor is authorized to pay such Professional 80% of the fees and 100% of the expenses requested in such Monthly Fee Application. If an objection is filed to the Monthly Fee Application, then the Debtor is authorized to pay 80% of the fees and 100% of the expenses not subject to the objection.

### **RELIEF REQUESTED**

9. Sierra submits this Application (a) for allowance of reasonable compensation for the actual, reasonable and necessary professional services that it rendered as environmental consultant for the Committee in this case for the period of August 1, 2014 through August 31, 2014 and (b) for reimbursement of actual, reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in representing the Committee during that same period. During the Application Period, Sierra conducted environmental services with respect to the Debtor’s Vernon recycling facility. These activities generally included, review of documents and participation in project conference calls.



10. During the period covered by this Application, Sierra incurred fees in the amount of \$2,731.25 and actual, reasonable and necessary expenses totaling \$0. As of the date of this Application, Sierra has not received any payment for the fees and expenses requested herein.

11. Exhibit A hereto contains logs which reflect the time expended by each individual who performed services and a description of the services provided by each such individual on a daily basis.<sup>3</sup>

12. Section 330 of the Bankruptcy Code provides that the Bankruptcy Court may award a professional person “reasonable compensation for actual, necessary services rendered ... and reimbursement for actual, necessary expenses.” 11 U.S.C. § 330(a)(1). Section 330 of the Bankruptcy Code also sets forth certain criteria for the award of such compensation and reimbursement:

In determining the amount of reasonable compensation to be awarded..., the court shall consider the nature, the extent, and the value of such services, taking into account all relevant factors, including –

- (A) the time spent on such services;
- (B) the rates charged for such services;
- (C) whether the services were necessary to the administration of, or beneficial at the time at which the service was rendered toward the completion of, a case under this title;
- (D) whether the services were performed within a reasonable amount of time commensurate with the complexity, importance, and nature of the problem, issue, or task addressed; and
- (E) whether the compensation is reasonable based on the customary compensation charged by comparably skilled practitioners in cases other than cases under this title.

*Id.* 11 U.S.C. § 330(a)(3).

Sierra is excused from keeping time records in tenth-hour increments.

13. Sierra submits that the compensation requested in this Application is reasonable taking into account the various factors outlined in Section 330 of the Bankruptcy Code.

14. Sierra does not charge for photocopying.

15. In accordance with Local Rule 2016-2, Sierra has reduced its request for compensation for non-working travel to 50% of its normal hourly rate.

16. Sierra has endeavored to represent the Committee in the most expeditious and economical manner possible. Tasks have been assigned to professionals, paraprofessionals and other support staff at Sierra so that work has been performed by those most familiar with the particular matter or task in the most economical manner. Sierra believes that it has been successful in this regard.

17. In addition, Sierra coordinated its efforts with the Committee's other professionals to avoid duplication of efforts.

18. Except as allowed under section 504 (b) of the Bankruptcy Code, no agreement or understanding exists between Sierra and any other person, for the sharing of compensation received or to be received for services rendered in or in connection with this case.

19. The undersigned has reviewed the requirements of Local Rule 2016-2 and certifies to the best of his information, knowledge and belief that this Application substantially complies with that Rule.

**WHEREFORE**, Sierra respectfully requests that this Court: (a) allow Sierra (i) compensation in the amount of \$2,185.00 (\$2,731.25 minus a 20% holdback of \$546.25) for actual, reasonable and necessary professional services rendered on behalf of the Committee during the period August 1, 2014 through August 31, 2014, and (ii) reimbursement of \$0 for actual, reasonable and necessary expenses incurred during the same period; (b) authorize and direct the Debtor to pay to Sierra the amount of its allowed compensation and allowed expense reimbursement; and (c) grant such other and further relief as is just and proper.
